Presidents Report

GHD has now completed the EIS for the Newcastle City Council (NCC) section of the Trail and a DA is expected to be the NCC website in February 2020. This part of the Trail covers the areas of Shortland to Tarro, Hexham to Minmi and Fletcher. The President praised the work of Jeoff Wickens and Antonia who have worked on NCC in developing the DA. The President and others walked some of the Trail near Tarro and located an existing tunnel under the New

England Highway which may negate the need for a bridge to be built over the highway.

Cessnock City Council (CCC) need to hire a project manager and will need to pay for a biodiversity study of the Pambalong Nature Reserve. Funding needs to be obtained to enable work to start on the EIS.

Stakeholders on both NCC and CCC sections include Arizon, National Parks and Wildlife Service, NSW Crown Lands | Department of Planning, Industry and Environment, Yancoal and Hunter District Water Board.

- A combined Council working group will meet early in 2020. This group will consist of:
 - Brian Adamthwaite LMCCDeclan Clausen NCCDarrin Gray CCC
- CCC is committed to the Rail Trail Project it is in the Lower Hunter Regional Plan and is a State Significant Project
- CCC needs external funding from State and/or Federal sources. Funding to start is estimated at about \$200 000.
- NCC has the advantage of greater funds from a greater population that CCC and NCC can link the Rail Trail to the funding for traffic management on the New England Highway where bikes need to be removed for safety reasons.
- Sam Reich asked whether the local wine industry may be interested in helping with funding. Cr Gray said the industry is prepared to fund from Pelaw Main to the vineyards but has not expressed interest in funding the Rail Trail east of Pelaw Main.

Kate Harris

- There is no budget line for a draft review from GHD and completion of an EIS which will require about \$75 000 to get to approval, working drawings, drone survey. A dedicated project manager on a 2 year contract would be needed to drive the project at a cost of \$170 000 per annum.
- o CCC new General Manager has been briefed on the Project
- A significant issue for CCC will be acquisition of private land and dealing with Native Titile Claims.
